Don't Flatter Yourself... or Anyone Else!

Monroe replied to his concern, "A little flattery will support a man through great fatigue."

Wisdom Literature teaches flattery proceeds from an open grave and sets a trap before man's feet (Psalm 5:9; Proverbs 29:5). So what is the problem with flattery? Philippians 2:3 gives a clear answer to that question. "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself." We all know the dangers of selfish ambition and conceit. These are the desires that justify the trampling of others underfoot for the sake of personal gain. No one likes that. And on the opposite side is esteem of others in lowliness of mind. This is the careful consideration of others and how they can succeed through our humble efforts of edification. This produces effective team building.

If one was to build another up with arrogance and self-seeking instead of lowliness of mind, the words he would speak to another would be nothing more than flattery! And even if the flattery is a true statement, comes from ... Continued

a place of superiority. While praise is paid with the mouth, the heart despises the receiver of flattery, using them for selfish gain. Jude says in verse 16 of his one chapter book, "These are grumblers, complainers, walking according to their own lusts; and they mouth great swelling words, flattering people to gain advantage." And again in Romans 16:18 Paul states, "For those who are such do not serve our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly, and by smooth words and flattering speech deceive the hearts of the simple."

If you want favors, give flattery. If you want friendship, give compliments. It is important for people to hear nice things about themselves. "*Pleasant words are like a honey-comb, Sweetness to the soul and health to the bones.*" (Proverbs 16:24) Pleasant words, or compliments, encourage people for within them are truth, openness, and humility. Flattering words, for a time, seem pleasant, but when found out, they deflate the soul as one realizes their deception.

Make certain that the next kind word you speak is truly that, kind. A compliment is kind, flattery is not. The difference is found in the heart. "A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks." (Luke 6:45) Choose the good.
